We are the Cultural Connectors

The Connecting Culture project aimed to connect young people to cultural organisations and opportunities in Southampton and use their voices to influence the development of Southampton as a creative city. It began with a Creative Consultation programme and research in schools and other learning/support settings with 600 children and young people.

We, the Cultural Connectors – a team of local young people aged I6-25 – had the opportunity to programme an arts festival 'What's Next Southampton? in June 2023. It was designed to give back to the community. We believe that such experiences should be accessible to all people.

This manifesto places young people at the forefront of our vision of the future.

By placing the focus on young people, we wish to mobilise a generation who feel empowered to **use their voices and be agents for change**. We want to encourage young people to **want more for and from Southampton** and to shape the city they will inherit.

We want an easy way to find out about what's going on around Southampton, and the ability to get to activity independently.

Often, we only find out about activities because our school told us about them, so we want a way of exploring all our options ourselves. We want better transport to help us be more independent and feel safe travelling around our city.

How will you enable children and young people across Southampton?

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About the Connecting Culture project

Connecting Culture (2019-2024) was a ground-breaking project, led by University of Southampton (Arts & Culture) with a large consortium of cultural organisations and child-focused services.

The project explored how Southampton's thriving Cultural Quarter can enrich the lives of children and young people as a future creative hub. It centred the voices and opinions of Southampton's children and young people to ensure they are heard and acted upon to influence the city's cultural development.

Creative Consultation workshops were delivered by local artists Nazneen Ahmed, Faye Philips and Natalie Watson. Around 600 children from I6 schools and youthsettings took part. Their voices formed a picture of how children and young people would like to experience **creative activity across Southampton in the future**. A live digital tool, **Culture Mapper**, was developed to record the range of cultural and creative activities engaging children and young people in Southampton. Over time the aim is to provide data on the range of creative engagements, and where they have been located. It will support the cultural sector to work together to understand networks and existing connections, share ideas or best practice, and give peer support and learning.

The Cultural Connectors drew on the ideas and dreams of the City's children to inform this Radical Guide for Change. It is informed by their research, data from the Creative Consultation programme and their own experiences of arts and culture in Southampton. The hope is that the manifesto will be adopted by the people and leaders of the city and will help spark a cultural and creative environment that reflects the needs of children and young people across Southampton.

The power of young people

We recruited our six young **Cultural Connectors** in 2022 to empower youth voice within the city's cultural sector. They embarked on a dynamic research traineeship and cultural leadership programme with us.

As young researchers, they got to the heart of what children and young people want in Southampton. Their research, vision and aspirations for the city led to the incredible What's Next Southampton? festival. The free arts, fashion and music festival united local arts organisations and filled Guildhall Square and Cultural Quarter venues with inclusive activities for children, young people and families. We couldn't be happier with the result of placing our trust in young people, and urge other organisations to do the same.
